## Questions to Consider ~ Section 3

We need to ask ourselves the **least** questions when we read through the book of Isaiah 54.

Take some time to consider the verses that were shared in the session, including extra scripture that was mentioned and apply that to your understanding of what it means to be Rescued by God.

The first thing to remember is that we want to look at our heart like a garden in which God is the master gardener. He is eager to do a mighty work within you. Will you allow Him?

Restore: God will grow, nurture and produce out of the abundance of your heart.

As you see the fruit growing in your life, remember it is meant to be shared with others.

This garden of your heart is the sacred heart of the Holy One, embrace His plans and his will for your life. As you think on the ideas and the scriptures shared, begin writing down the hopes and passions that He has started in you.

Out of the abundance of the heart, the mouth speaks words of truth, life, and hope. (Matthew 12:34)You are meant to be a light bearing, burden breaking, hope chasing, kingdom dwelling daughter of the most High.

He is laying your foundations upon the sapphire sea of His throne, surrounding you and antimony and building your walls of transparent agate crystals, so that all who look at you see Him. Let your dwelling be a welcome place all who come can find the rescuing, redeeming, and restoring love of God.

These secret things of God belong to us that we may reveal them to others. Deuteronomy 29:29
